

# Bristol International Airport Development Proposals 2009

## Welcome to our pre-application consultation

Later this year, Bristol International Airport intends to submit a planning application for the development of the airport. This will include proposals to extend the terminal building, provide additional car parking, provide additional space for aircraft and a range of mitigation and enhancement proposals.

We are holding this pre-application consultation so that we can understand your views and answer your questions prior to the submission of the planning application. The proposals will identify development that is needed to handle 10 million passengers per annum at the airport and we want to hear what you think before we finalise our application.

Exhibitions are being held in January and February in the Administration Building at Bristol International Airport. There will be an opportunity to discuss our proposals with Airport Staff as indicated opposite.
