An Airside Safety Alert (ASA) will be issued to communicate immediate safety concerns relating to operations, equipment or environment; and to highlight negative safety trends. It is the responsibility of all employers to ensure that relevant ASAs are brought to the attention of their staff.

### 1. OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this Safety Alert is to support all airside business partners and Bristol Airport departments that operate airside to understand the impact of restart activities on their staff and the potential human factors (HF) risks they should be aware of and should be managing.

### 2. SCOPE

The impact of Covid-19 has been significant across the aviation industry, with the majority of operations either ceasing or being greatly reduced. The industry is now developing restart activities to return to some level of commercial flying operation. There may be a negative impact on the performance of people within the aviation system after months of inactivity, and with continued uncertainty about the industry's recovery.

In light of this, the CAA have prepared a Safety Notification (attached and linked below) providing information on the key HF matters and recommendations on how to manage and mitigate those risks.
